What do you hope for the future of **CityAve?**

We want to see the area continue to redevelop in positive manner. The adoption of the overlay district plan will allow new and exciting

development opportunities that the area would support. The current zoning is very limiting and does not enable world class development.

How about Presidential? What's happening there?

A lot. We expect to complete construction by June of 2008. The excitement generated from this project has been unprecedented. Leasing is exceeding our expectation which shows that there is a strong demand for Class A office in Bala Cynwyd. We are currently over 50% leased at some of the highest rental rates ever seen in Bala Cynwyd. Our signed tenants include Hamilton Lane Advisors, Global Employment, Urological Associates and CitiBank. We are in discussions with other office and retail tenants which should enable us to fully lease the property.

Keystone Property Group has moved into temporary space within One Presidential and expects to move into our permanent offices in June.

We are also starting to upgrade 225 City Avenue. This project is also receiving great leasing activity. We will be upgrading the interior and exterior creating a more attractive project. There will be several new retail tenants which help make the area even more desirable.

A crowd of about 50 people met on Feb. 7th at the newly renovated Crowne Plaza Hotel. Ooooh la-la was the general feeling. CABA members were treated to a pasta station that got outstanding reviews. The committee members include three representatives from each local civic association, CityAve District Board members who represent a variety of businesses in the District as well as ex-officio members like Councilman Curtis Jones Jr., Commissioner Bruce Reed, Commissioner Liz Rogan, Commissioner Brian Gordon and

Commissioner George Manos and State Representative Kathy Manderino. "It was a very productive meeting. We have a great advisory committee for the Zoning Project. We were also honored to have new Councilman Curtis Jones Jr. attend the meeting on his very first day on the job. His dedication and interest are appreciated," said Terry Foley, CEO and President of the CityAve District.

Three work groups generated ideas and presented summaries to the group. KSK will incorporate these suggestions into their plans and present a revised plan to the group in March. In June it is expected that there will be a public meeting.
