

Farms Club to preserve and protect the historic fabric of the neighborhood, which has been listed on the National Register of Historic Places since 1985. The 63rd Street Streetscape was funded by the City Avenue Special Services District, the City of Philadelphia and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. State Senator Vincent Hughes said, "I am pleased to see the completion of this vital community project. Having supported the City Avenue Special Services District on the 63rd Street Streetscape project from its inception to its completion, it is wonderful to have taken this journey with City Avenue and the other supporters of this project. The 63rd Streetscape is so very vital to the community -- the safety improvements now mean residents will have a new and improved quality of life and the revitalization of this corridor of Overbrook has given new possibilities to this neighborhood, drawing economic opportunities and enhancing sustainability efforts. It was a pleasure to be a part of such a positive community endeavor. I look forward to working with City Avenue on future projects such as this."

Financial support from Philadelphia was procured with the assistance of Councilman Curtis Jones, Jr., who noted, "As a different shade of 'green', Philadelphia keeps its commitment to becoming one of the greenest cities in America, one streetscape at a time. Bala Avenue Streetscape Improvement Project Update

Streetscape improvements are almost complete on Bala Avenue and will be finalized in May. The streetscape project will help stimulate the revitalization of the corridor's commercial district. This project will also help to improve pedestrian safety. Textured crosswalks will be installed at intersections along Bala Ave. from Union Ave. to Montgomery Ave. Already installed red brick bump-outs, or curb extensions, at the intersection of Bala Ave. and Highland Ave. will reduce the pedestrian crossing distance and help to slow traffic through this winding portion of the corridor. Finally, the intersection of Bala Ave. and Union Ave. has been converted to a four-way stop, with flashing red signals. The intersection improvement will force traffic using Bala Ave. as a cut-through between City and Montgomery Avenues to come to a complete stop, allowing people a safe crossing to the Bala Gym and Bala Avenue Playground. The project replaced the existing cobra-head highway lighting with more decorative, village-scale lighting fixtures. These street lights illuminate the corridor more evenly, further enhancing its walkability and safety. Ornamental street trees will be planted along Bala Ave., enhancing the "green" environment, while combining with the other improvements to soften the feel of the commercial district. By encouraging pedestrian traffic and enhancing safety through the shopping district, the project will also have a positive effect on the surrounding residential neighborhoods. People love to live where they can walk to shop and dine.

The project is funded by the City Avenue Special Services District, Lower Merion Township, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
